While many communities have celebrated Canada 150 in a variety of ways, the community

nity has settled into the fall schedule, after the busyness of summer. Chair Jo-Anne Fletcher explained that the event originated with strategic planning meetings that took place in the local United Church that has always been very connected with the local community. It is the church's desire to be more relevant and engage local residents. Organizers hope that the event will capture the spirit of the former "Lyn Days" which have not

taken place for many years. "We hope it brings people in to see what a great place Lyn is," commented Fletcher. She reported that there has been lots of interest from volunteers and service groups as well as great support from the Elizabethtown-Kitley Township and Burnbrae Farms who are providing the breakfast at the Christ United Church on Saturday morning. The event actually begins on Friday with a chicken BBQ at the church from

4-6pm with advanced tickets required by calling 613-498-0827, followed by "fun and games". Saturday events begin at 10am and include a car show, craft sale, bouncy houses, petting zoo, 4H exhibits and an antique fire equipment display at Douglas Scott Park along with artisans at the Lyn Museum and the Citizen of the Year being announced at 11:30.

Canoe and Kayak races will take place in the Lyn Conservation

Area (Lyn Pit) from 1-4 pm and those interested can preregister at JJ's Snack Shack. Participants can provide your own team or a team can be made up for you. Canoes, Kayaks, and flotation devices will be provided by the Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority. Many of the proceeds from Lyn's Canada 150 celebration go back into the community through the Christ United Church's Outreach Fund.
